we chose to do the work ourselves, we were able to expand the project to include not only the replacement of the carpet in our auditorium, entryways, and hallways but also the repainting of the auditorium walls and doorways, and re-carpeting the stairs to the hallways of the lower level and still stay within our budgeted amount!

The church secretary's office had new flooring installed and both her office and Pastor Hack's study have been repainted and redecorated.

Another big project was the replacement of the commercial size refrigerator in the church kitchen. Many thanks to all who helped to carry the old unit out for disposal and bring the new one in and get it ready to go.

The lighting above the baptistry has been updated and has already added a special charm to the aesthetics of our auditorium for our services.

This year saw us needing to replace two of the sump pumps in our lower level. We are thankful to have caught that need without having to deal with a flooded basement beforehand.

It was decided that it was time to part ways with the 15-passenger church van and so we bid it "farewell" (a fond one or otherwise).

Our parking lot on the north side of the building was resealed and designated parking slots for senior saints and individuals with a handicap were expanded/included.

We continue to make much needed improvements to our church sound system to improve the quality for those present in our services as well as for those who are listening via livestream and rebroadcast via the internet.

We added a project during the year by making arrangements to have the protective coverings of many of the stained-glass windows on the original building replaced. That work was completed in December and the windows are now visible once again. They look great! Stop by and check them out anytime, but especially when it is dark outside and the lights inside are lit up.

A big 'Thank You' to each of the dedicated men who serve as our trustees!







Summer Camp Program

Through AWANA, the church provides a way for children to earn an opportunity to go to summer camp, either at Skyview Ranch in Millersburg or Camp Patmos on Kelley's Island. The T&T (3rd-6th Grade) work hard throughout the year to finish their books to earn a full one week paid scholarship to camp. This year we were able to send 12 girls and boys to camp. It is such a privilege to see how hard the boys and girls work at finishing their books.

We are hoping to send more kids this coming year!







Dear Brothers and Sisters,

2023 has been a year of change for the Children's Church ministry. After having 20 or more children in the ministry during the summer with limited volunteers we adjusted the age range to 3 years old to 1st grade while allowing the 2nd graders to finish the year out. We held an organizational meeting in August which included some training, and we picked up a few more volunteers. Samuel Butler programmed



check-in software for us to use, which has been a huge help and will help us in the future. The software allows us to keep track of the children and any specific needs they may have. Over the past 10 weeks we have had a total of 131 children (average of about 13). Our largest week during that time frame was 21. Overall, 44 different children have been ministered to in the previous 10 weeks. We are using lanyards to help visually identify the leaders and their names. We have 23 adult leaders and 7 or more teen/youth helpers. These volunteers allow for about a 7-week rotation which helps to minimize the amount of time a teacher team is away from the morning service. Pastor Luke, Deanna and Adam Laskos work on the schedule for the volunteers. Jeanna Guzman puts together the video lessons and prints the materials from the Gospel Project. The Gospel Project curriculum went through the Gospels during the fall, and we are now covering the book of Acts. The children sing songs, pray, learn a bible lesson, have snacks, and have different activities (games, coloring, etc...). We are thankful for all the volunteers that put time into this ministry and the children that participate.

Looking forward to seeing how the Lord uses this ministry in 2024!


